CEMETERY COMMITTEE

THE TOWN OF LUMBERLAND IS ACTIVELY SEEKING ANYONE INTERESTED IN BECOMING A VOLUNTEER MEMBER OF THE LUMBERLAND CEMETERY COMMITTEE. THE COMMITTEE MEETS THE LAST WEDNESDAY OF EACH MONTH AT 9 A.M. IN THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING AND OVERSEES THE TOWN CEMETERIES AND MAKES RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE TOWN BOARD. THERE ARE THREE OPENINGS FOR MEMBERS.

DOG LICENSING

THE TOWN OF LUMBERLAND REQUIRES ALL DOGS HARBORED IN THE TOWN OF LUMBERLAND BE LICENSED. A VALID RABIES CERTIFICATE IS THE REQUIREMENT TO LICENSE YOUR PET. FOR THOSE SENIOR CITIZENS (65+) YOU WILL ONLY HAVE TO PAY \$1 ANNUALLY FOR EACH SPAYED/NEUTERED DOG AND \$3 FOR EACH UNSPAYED/UNNEUTERED DOG. ALL OTHER LICENSES ARE \$3.50 ANNUALLY FOR EACH SPAYED/NEUTERED DOG AND \$13.50 FOR EACH UNSPAYED/UNNEUTERED DOG. IT IS FOR YOUR SAFETY THAT YOU LICENSE YOUR DOG. IF YOUR DOG IS PICKED UP BY OUR DOG CONTROL OFFICER AND TAKEN TO THE SHELTER THE CHARGE IS \$10 FOR THE 1ST TIME, \$20 THE SECOND TIME AND \$30 FOR THE 3RD TIME WITHIN A 12 MONTH PERIOD. THERE IS ALSO A \$3 A DAY CHARGE ADDED TO THAT IMPOUNDMENT FEE. THE TOWN OF LUMBERLAND HAS A LEASH LAW.

E-Z PASS ON THE GO PROGRAM

THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE IS SELLING E-Z PASS ON THE GO KITS. THE COST PER KIT IS \$25. ONCE YOU PURCHASE THE PASS FROM THIS OFFICE IT WILL BE YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO REGISTER THE PASS WITHIN 48 HOURS VIA PHONE OR INTERNET. THE PASS CANNOT BE USED UNTIL IT IS REGISTERED. FOR MORE INFORMATION YOU CAN CLICK ONTO www.e-zpassny.com IT WILL BE YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO PUT MORE MONEY ON THE PASS ONCE YOUR BALANCE IS LOW. E-Z PASSES ARE NOW ACCEPTED FOR USE IN 15 STATES

Applicants must prove NYS residency for one year prior to the application. Acceptable residency proofs are the same as for annual licenses with the exception of the one-year requirement. When purchasing a lifetime license for a child, the purchaser must bring a copy of the child's birth certificate and a copy of a parent's residency proof.

What is the Hemlock Woolly Adelgid (HWA)?

This aphid-like insect damages hemlock trees by sucking out moisture and nutrients while it feeds. More HWA facts:

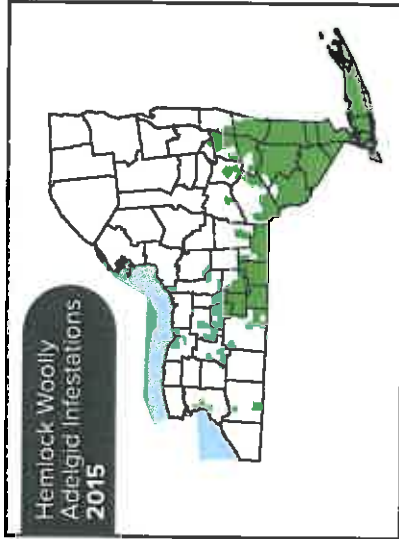
- Adults are purple-black, 1.5 mm long (barely visible)
- HWA stay attached to host trees most of their lives
- Woolly egg masses contain 50-300 eggs
- Eggs hatch into "crawlers" that spread to other trees, attaching to the underside of twigs near base of needles

Why are Eastern Hemlock Trees Important?

Eastern hemlocks (*Tsuga canadensis*) are highly beneficial to the environment. These evergreens prevent erosion and maintain water quality because they are well suited for growing along steep slopes, where their roots help stabilize the soil. Hemlocks have a dense canopy that offers ideal habitat for birds and other wildlife. They shade streams and rivers, providing the cold water conditions essential for many fish species, including brook trout.

Where is the Hemlock Woolly Adelgid Found?

The hemlock woolly adelgid was first confirmed in New York State in the lower Hudson Valley in the 1980s and has since spread north and west.

These invasive insects are spreading throughout New York State and have the potential to devastate our hemlock population. Help us track this tree killer by learning to identify and report hemlock woolly adelgid infestations.

TWO WAYS TO HELP

1. Contact the DEC if you see small woolly egg masses (1/16 to 1/8-inch) on the underside of hemlock branches. (The adult insect is tiny and difficult to see without a hand lens.) Hemlock trees that are infested often appear stressed and lose needles.
2. Participate in a more in-depth survey for this insect by using the form at www.dec.ny.gov/animals/82617.html to document and report your findings to DEC. Submit the form online or by mail.



How to Recognize Hemlock Trees



Two white parallel lines on the undersides of needles



Gray-brown bark, with wide ridges and furrows

Flat evergreen needles, ranging from 1/3 to 2/3-inch long



Cones about 1/2-inch long and green when immature



Hemlock Woolly Adelgid Imposters

You may see these look-a-likes on hemlock trees.



ELONGATE HEMLOCK SCALE
White or brown ovals on underside of needles (invasive insect - report to DEC)



TREE SAP
Paint-like splatter (not harmful)



SPIDER EGG SACS
Large balls of webbing, often connecting multiple needles and twigs (not harmful)

SPITTLEBUGS
Wet mass of bubbles (not harmful)
