Greetings from your Constabulary. We hope that all are enjoying the fall. In this issue of the newsletter we would like to touch upon TELEMARKETING SCAMS and what can be done about it. Some pointers gleaned from Crime in America publications are noted below for your information.

TELEMARKETING SCAMS

One of the most popular ways to scam seniors is through the use of a telephone. Telemarketers often offer fake prizes such as free vacations and jewelry. They also solicit for bogus charities. Seniors tend to be the victims due to the fact that they grew up in an era where they could trust people. Good folk (back in the day) were never rude and never hung up on anyone.

AVOIDING TELEMARKETING SCAMS

- Don't talk to them. Get an answering machine, caller I.D. or just hang up.
- Take down the phone number and report it.
- If you want to give money to a charity, seek them out yourself.
- Your local Police Department will never solicit money via phone.
- Get on the Federal DO-NOT-CALL list. Call **1-800-DONOTCALL** or go online and register at **www.donotcall.gov**.

THIS IS THE LAW

Federal Trade Commission (FTC) regulations require the following:

1. You must first be told the company's name and what is being sold.
2. If a prize is offered, you must be told right away that no purchase is necessary.
3. You must not be asked to pay in advance for services.
4. You must not be called before 8:00 a.m. and after 9:00 p.m.
You must not be called repeatedly or be intimidated by the caller.
5. You must be told the total cost before you are required to pay for products or services.



GENERAL ELECTION

Mail Registration

Applications must be postmarked not later than October 11th and received by a board of elections not later than October 16th to be eligible to vote in the General Election.

In Person Registration

You may register at your local board of elections or any state agency participating in the National voter Registration Act, on any business day throughout the year but, to be eligible to vote in the November general election, your application must be received no later than October 11th except, if you have been honorable discharged from the military or have become a naturalized citizen since October 11th, you may register in person at the board of elections up until October 25th.

Change of Address

Notices of change of address from registered voters received by October 16th by a county board of elections must be processed and entered in the records in time for the general elections.

Dear Friends!

It's that time of year again! Daylight savings time begins Sunday November 3. So that makes it time to:

1. Clean your chimney!
2. Clean the boiler.
3. Change the smoke detector batteries.


Speaking of smoke detectors and batteries, do you have a Carbon Monoxide detector? This small relatively inexpensive piece of equipment can save your life. It reads the parts per million of carbon monoxide that may be escaping in faulty heating equipment in your home. CO2 is an odorless, tasteless gas. Depending on the concentration and duration of CO2 that is in the air, this harmful gas can kill you in a very short amount of time. Please invest in a CO2 detector for at least every floor of your home, especially in the bedrooms. Take the detector seriously when it activates. Call 911.

Take a walk around your home. Are any exit doors blocked? How's access to your loved ones? Can we fit a stretcher in your home if we needed to? In a fire, are there two doors exiting your home that are clear of furniture or storage? Please double check your elders homes too!

When cleaning your chimney, pay extra attention to fire place inserts. The elbow that turn from the back of the woodstove and up into the chimney are a hot bed of coals and creosote. This elbow connection is often over looked when a chimney is cleaned because it is difficult to access. Additionally, if the woodstove is an insert, there is often a shelf in the fireplace itself above the elbow that can collect coals and debris, its just how the original fireplace was designed. **KNOW YOUR HEATING SYSTEM!**

Assistance for Low and Moderate Income Households

NYSERDA Programs

Income-qualified families are particularly susceptible to high and fluctuating energy costs, based on the earnings to expenditure ratio. To reduce the energy burden on these households, NYSERDA offers the following programs that provide cost-effective home improvements:

Assisted Home Performance with ENERGY STAR®

New York State households with a total income equal to or lower than 80% of the Uniformity with State or Area Median Income, whichever is greater, may receive additional financial incentives to improve the energy efficiency of their home through Assisted Home Performance with ENERGY STAR. Income-eligible households can receive a subsidy (Assisted Subsidy) representing up to 50% of an approved energy efficiency project. Assisted New York ENERGY STAR Homes

Receive a \$500 cash incentive if your household income is less than or equal to these [guidelines](#). For more information or help with income-eligibility verification, please call 1-877-NY-SMART.

EmPower New YorkSM

The EmPower program has provided more than 61,000 income-eligible New Yorkers with insulation, draft reduction, high efficiency lighting, or appliance upgrades—**for free**.

Low-Income Forum on Energy

The [Low-Income Forum on Energy \(LIFE\)](#) brings together organizations and individuals committed to addressing the challenges and opportunities facing low-income New Yorkers as they seek safe, affordable and reliable energy.

Additional Programs

Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP)

Administered by the New York State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA), HEAP provides financial assistance to eligible households to help pay for their home heating costs. To be eligible, a household must meet income guidelines; [60% of the State Median Income or below](#) and either pay directly for heating costs or pay rent that includes heating costs. Individual applicants must be U.S. citizens or qualified aliens. To learn more and see if you are eligible, visit the [Home Energy Assistance Program](#) site.

Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP)

Administered by the New York State Homes and Community Renewal (HCR), WAP assists [income-eligible families and individuals](#) by reducing their heating/cooling costs and improving the safety of their homes through energy efficiency measures. Both single family and multifamily buildings are eligible. Program services are available to both homeowners and renters, with priority given to senior citizens, families with children and persons with disabilities.

Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee Disaster Assistance

Funding is available to New York State residents to help repair and replace furnace damaged as a result of Hurricane Irene and Tropical Storm Lee.

Funding will provide help to homeowners for their primary and/or permanent residence in the 34 counties that have been declared eligible for disaster assistance and any that are subsequently added by the federal government. Those counties are: Albany, Bronx, Broome, Chemung, Chenango, Clinton, Columbia, Delaware, Dutchess, Essex, Fulton, Greene, Herkimer, Kings, Montgomery, Nassau, Oneida, Orange, Otsego, Putnam, Queens, Rensselaer, Richmond, Rockland, Saratoga, Schenectady, Schoharie, Suffolk, Sullivan, Tioga, Ulster, Warren, Washington, and Westchester.

The funding is made available through a collaboration between New York State Homes and Community Renewal (HCR) and the State Office of Temporary and Disability Assistance (OTDA). Up to \$6,000 per applicant is available to households that qualify. Work will include repair or replacement of the furnace, boiler or hot-water heater as well as repair or replacement of duct work, fuel tanks, venting systems, or other items essential to the safe operation of the heating system. Assistance is limited to single family homes and duplexes.

Furnace repair and replacement in affected counties will be operated through the Weatherization Assistance Program (WAP) overseen by HCR. Through this program, HCR contracts with experienced local providers to do work. Assistance will be provided on a first-come, first-served basis to those whose homeowner's insurance does not cover the damage, or have applied for assistance through the Federal Emergency Management Agency and have been either rejected or received an inadequate payment.

Households cannot have liquid resources exceeding \$5,000 and must meet certain income eligibility guidelines, which can be found at <http://nysdhcr.gov/Programs/WeatherizationAssistance/>.


