CONSTABULARY

Your Constabulary hopes that all residents will enjoy the holidays as we are about to ring in the New Year. We earnestly look forward to serving you and our community in the coming year.

It has come to my attention over the course of the past year that several of you have received dubious mailings either via email or local post office delivery. These communications, no matter what form they take, are **CON GAMES** propagated by thieves otherwise known as **CON ARTISTS**. These con artists have only one goal in mind when they are able to contact you and that is the acquisition of your money at any cost.

Here is an example of how mail fraud works:

- You will receive a letter in the mail containing a check for a large sum of money issued in your name. The letter will seem official whereas the author states that you have either won a sweepstakes or are entitled to an inheritance or some other ridiculous con. The check will not be cashable at any bank that has sharp tellers, so in essence it is worthless. The con artist will have you call a number on the letterhead prior to you cashing the fake check at which time you will be asked for your date of birth, social security number etc. This scammer will now use this information to either get a loan, buy merchandise or whatever as you are now a victim of identity theft. Once this scam is perpetrated it is extremely hard to bring the culprits to justice because they remain faceless and you unfortunately have an almost zero chance of retrieving your stolen funds. What these scammers can do in one day or even an hour could take years for you to clear your name from creditors and such.

Here is an example of how internet (electronic) e-mail fraud works:

- You will receive an apparent official email from an ambassador, envoy, president, prince, king etc., of some far off land stating that they have contacted you because they believe you can be trusted. The scammer will imply that there is an emergency whereas only he has knowledge and you must tell no one. The con artist will gain your trust this way. The scammer will then tell you he has access to millions of dollars of currency, gold, diamonds or other nonsense. This is where the con man needs you. He will initially request a small amount of money from you so that he can get documentation for the alleged assets. He will at some point contact you for more money. You, the innocent kindhearted individual has just wired hundreds, perhaps thousands of dollars to a faceless scam artist. The con man told you he was going to split the assets but these assets never existed. In the end you are left with a light wallet and feeling victimized.

If you are contacted by anyone and it appears too good to be true, it probably is. Be aware and know that people don't throw their money away to strangers.

Be smart. Be aware!
