Greetings from your Constabulary

As we anticipate the arrival of spring. Again, we think that it is important to explain the DMV point system should you find yourself in the unhappy situation of receiving a traffic ticket for violating the rules of the road. Driving your car can be taken for granted but it is an awesome responsibility. Many people do not realize that your ability to obtain a license to drive from the Department of Motor Vehicles is a privilege. It is not a right. You must pass a driver's test and have a basic understanding of the 'rules of the road'. Most of us understand this but we can lose our way at times. It can happen to any of us for a variety of reasons both accidental and intentional.

The following is a brief outline provided by the Department of Motor Vehicles concerning penalties imposed for various infractions that will affect your license. A point system is utilized by the Department of Motor Vehicles whereas too many can cause your license to be suspended or revoked which can directly affect your insurance rates.

"Points" are assessed against your driving record based on the date you committed the violation, not the date you were convicted in court. If you accumulate 11 or more points in 18 months, you will be called to a DMV hearing, after which your license may be suspended or revoked. At the hearing you will be offered the option of waiving the hearing or accepting a definite period of suspension.

NOTE: Some license revocations and suspensions are mandatory and do not depend on points. These include three (3) speeding violations within 18 months, and convictions involving alcohol or drugs.

OUTDOOR BURNING BAN

SINCE OCTOBER, 2009, NEW YORK STATE DEPT. OF CONSERVATION HAS INSTITUTED A STATE WIDE BAN ON OUTDOOR BURNING FROM MARCH 15TH THROUGH MAY 15TH OF EACH YEAR.

TOWN PAVILION USE

WITH SPRING FAST APPROACHING THERE WILL BE EVENTS PLANNED THAT MAY NEED A LARGER VENUE THAN YOUR BACK YARDS. THE TOWN OF LUMBERLAND HAS A PUBLIC PAVILION FOR RESIDENTS' RESERVED USE. WE DO NOT TAKE ANY REQUESTS FOR THE USE OF THE PAVILION UNTIL APRIL, WEATHER PERMITTING. SINCE IT IS A PUBLIC PAVILION WE CANNOT PREVENT THOSE THAT MAY WANT TO JUST SIT DOWN OR BE OUT OF THE SUN FROM USING THE

PAVILION. EVEN THOUGH YOU MAY HAVE RESERVED THE USE OF THE PAVILION WE REQUEST YOU LEAVE A COUPLE OF TABLES CLOSEST TO THE PARK FREE, IF NEEDED. PLEASE BE AWARE THAT IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO RESERVE THE USE OF THE PAVILION YOU WILL NEED TO EMAIL THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE AT glenspeytownhall@libertybiz.rr.com WITH YOUR NAME, ADDRESS, CONTACT INFORMATION, THE DATE AND TIME OF THE EVENT, THE PURPOSE OF THE EVENT AND THE APPROXIMATE NUMBER OF PEOPLE THAT WILL BE ATTENDING. WE WILL VERIFY IF THE DATE IS AVAILABLE. RESERVING THE USE OF THE PAVILION IS ON A FIRST COME FIRST SERVE BASIS AND ALL TOWN RELATED FUNCTIONS HAVE PRIORITY.

PLEASE NOTE THAT CIRCLE PARK IS ADJACENT TO THE PAVILION AND THE BATHROOM FACILITIES ARE AVAILABLE IF THEY ARE OPENED AT THE TIME OF YOUR REQUESTED USE.

NOISE PERMITS

NOISE PERMITS ARE REQUIRED FOR THOSE EVENTS THAT HAVE GATHERINGS AND WILL HAVE MUSIC PLAYING. PLEASE BE ADVISED THAT THE TOWN OF LUMBERLAND TOWN BOARD APPROVES NOISE PERMITS AT THEIR MONTHLY TOWN BOARD MEETINGS THAT ARE HELD THE SECOND WEDNESDAY (AFTER THE FIRST MONDAY), HOWEVER, EVEN IF A PERMIT IS APPROVED IT DOES NOT EXEMPT YOU FROM HAVING A COMPLAINT ISSUED AND A POLICE AGENCY RESPONDING IF YOU ARE INFRINGING ON YOUR NEIGHBORS. ALL NOISE PERMIT REQUESTS SHOULD BE SUBMITTED A MONTH BEFORE THE EVENT TO ASSURE THE TOWN BOARD'S APPROVAL OR DISAPPROVAL. PLEASE CALL THE TOWN CLERK'S OFFICE IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS AND FOR THE NOISE PERMIT REQUEST FORMS.

Send "Payment #2" stub **ONLY** with your check **DUE by February 28, 2013**

Send remaining entire bill with your check **DUE by March 31, 2013**

LATE PAYMENT PENALTIES STRICTLY ENFORCED.

ALL tax payments postmarked after January 31, 2013 will be subject to late penalty as listed below.
