

## Greetings from your Constabulary

As we anticipate the arrival of summer. Again, we think that it is important to explain the DMV point system should you find yourself in the unhappy situation of receiving a traffic ticket for violating the rules of the road. Driving your car can be taken for granted but it is an awesome responsibility. Many people do not realize that your ability to obtain a license to drive from the Department of Motor Vehicles is a privilege. It is not a right. You must pass a driver's test and have a basic understanding of the 'rules of the road'. Most of us understand this but we can lose our way at times. It can happen to any of us for a variety of reasons both accidental and intentional.

The following is a brief outline provided by the Department of Motor Vehicles concerning penalties imposed for various infractions that will affect your license. A point system is utilized by the Department of Motor Vehicles whereas too many can cause your license to be suspended or revoked which can directly affect your insurance rates.

"Points" are assessed against your driving record based on the date you committed the violation, not the date you were convicted in court. If you accumulate 11 or more points in 18 months, you will be called to a DMV hearing, after which your license may be suspended or revoked. At the hearing you will be offered the option of waiving the hearing or accepting a definite period of suspension.

NOTE: Some license revocations and suspensions are mandatory and do not depend on points. These include three (3) speeding violations within 18 months, and convictions involving alcohol or drugs.

## DOG LICENSES




